

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# This Week's Readings

### First reading from 1 Kings 8.22-30, 8.41-43

<sup>22</sup>Then Solomon stood before the altar of the Lord in the presence of all the assembly of Israel, and spread out his hands to heaven. <sup>23</sup>He said, 'O Lord, God of Israel, there is no God like you in heaven above or on earth beneath, keeping covenant and steadfast love for your servants who walk before you with all their heart, <sup>24</sup>the covenant that you kept for your servant my father David as you declared to him; you promised with your mouth and have this day fulfilled with your hand. <sup>25</sup>Therefore, O Lord, God of Israel, keep for your servant my father David that which you promised him, saying, "There shall never fail you a successor before me to sit on the throne of Israel, if only your children look to their way, to walk before me as you have walked before me." <sup>26</sup>Therefore, O God of Israel, let your word be confirmed, which you promised to your servant my father David. <sup>27</sup> But will God indeed dwell on the earth? Even heaven and the highest heaven cannot contain you, much less this house that I have built! <sup>28</sup>Have regard to your servant's prayer and his plea, O Lord my God, heeding the cry and the prayer that your servant prays to you today; <sup>29</sup>that your eyes may be open night and day towards this house, the place of which you said, "My name shall be there", that you may heed the prayer that your servant prays towards this place. <sup>30</sup>Hear the plea of your servant and of your people Israel when they pray towards this place; O hear in heaven your dwelling-place; heed and forgive. <sup>41</sup>/Likewise when a foreigner, who is not of your people Israel, comes from a distant land because of your name <sup>42</sup>—for they shall hear of your great name, your mighty hand, and your outstretched arm—when a foreigner comes and prays towards this house, <sup>43</sup>then hear in heaven your dwelling-place, and do according to all that the foreigner calls to you, so that all the peoples of the earth may know your name and fear you, as do your people Israel, and so that they may know that your name has been invoked on this house that I have built. (Pause for reflection)

<sup>1</sup> How lovely is your dwelling-place:

O Lord God of hosts!

<sup>2</sup> My soul has a desire and longing to enter the courts of the Lord: my heart and my flesh rejoice in the living God.

<sup>3</sup> The sparrow has found her a home,

and the swallow a nest where she may lay her young:

even your altar, O Lord of hosts, my King and my God.

<sup>4</sup> Blessed are those who dwell in your house:

they will always be praising you.

<sup>5</sup> Blessed are those whose strength is in you:

in whose heart are the highways to Zion;

<sup>6</sup> Who, going through the valley of dryness, find there a spring from which to drink: till the autumn rain shall clothe it with blessings.

#### Second Reading from Ephesians 6.10-20

<sup>10</sup>Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his power. <sup>11</sup>Put on the whole armour of God, so that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. <sup>12</sup>For our struggle is not against enemies of blood and flesh, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers of this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. <sup>13</sup>Therefore take up the whole armour of God, so that you may be able to withstand on that evil day, and having done everything, to stand firm. <sup>14</sup>Stand therefore, and fasten the belt of truth around your waist, and put on the breastplate of righteousness. <sup>15</sup>As shoes for your feet put on whatever will make you ready to proclaim the gospel of peace. <sup>16</sup>With all of these, take the shield of faith, with which you will be able to guench all the flaming arrows of the evil one. <sup>17</sup>Take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God. <sup>18</sup>Pray in the Spirit at all times in every prayer and supplication. To that end keep alert and always persevere in supplication for all the saints. <sup>19</sup>Pray also for me, so that when I speak, a message may be given to me to make known with boldness the mystery of the gospel, <sup>20</sup> for which I am an ambassador in chains. Pray that I may declare it boldly, as I must speak.

(Pause for reflection)

### The Holy Gospel

### The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John 66.56-69

#### **GLORY TO YOU, LORD JESUS CHRIST**

<sup>56</sup>Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me, and I in them. <sup>57</sup>Just as the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so whoever eats me will live because of me. 58This is the bread that came down from heaven, not like that which your ancestors ate, and they died. But the one who eats this bread will live for ever.' 59He said these things while he was teaching in the synagogue at Capernaum. <sup>60</sup>When many of his disciples heard it, they said, 'This teaching is difficult; who can accept it?' 61But Jesus, being aware that his disciples were complaining about it, said to them, 'Does this offend you? 62Then what if you were to see the Son of Man ascending to where he was before? <sup>63</sup>It is the spirit that gives life; the flesh is useless.

The words that I have spoken to you are spirit and life. <sup>64</sup>But among you there are some who do not believe.' For Jesus knew from the first who were the ones that did not believe, and who was the one that would betray him. <sup>65</sup>And he said, 'For this reason I have told you that no one can come to me unless it is granted by the Father.' <sup>66</sup>Because of this many of his disciples turned back and no longer went about with him. <sup>67</sup>So Jesus asked the twelve, 'Do you also wish to go away?' <sup>68</sup>Simon Peter answered him, 'Lord, to whom can we go? You have the words of eternal life. <sup>69</sup>We have come to believe and know that you are the Holy One of God.' (*Pause for reflection*)

Hear the Gospel of the Lord

PRAISE TO YOU LORD JESUS CHRIST

#### **REFLECTION**

#### **Prayers and Protection**

Call weaves through this week's scripture passages. The call to be faithful to the roots of Judaism, courageous in following Jesus, grounded in the love and presence of God, to live truth-telling lives, persevere and pray, even amid trying times.

1 Kings 8:(1, 6, 10–11), 22–30, 41–43 Solomon brings the Ark of the Covenant into the newly built temple, praising God for God's loyalty and God's faithfulness. A tension between sacred place and God's freedom emerges in this prayer, as Solomon acknowledges that the temple or anything in creation is unable to contain God. The Holy One remains free to move and free to love as God chooses. Reflecting that truth, Solomon asks God to hear prayers by those outside Israel in the midst of hearing of prayers by Israel.

In **Psalm 84**, we hear Pilgrims enter Jerusalem and the temple singing, "How lovely is your dwelling place." The temple has become the place in which even the sparrows and swallows come to dwell with God. As in Solomon's prayer, God makes room for stranger and foreigner as well as friend and kin.

**Ephesians 6:10–20** This week, we come to the final verses of this letter to the Ephesians, which, we recall, likely was not written by Paul but rather a follower of Paul. The author draws on a picture of God from Isaiah 59, in which God appears as a divine warrior who will bring about justice. The "armour of God" includes "the breastplate of righteousness," and "the helmet of salvation." In Isaiah, we hear that God alone fights for justice; Ephesians describes how the new Christian community is to prepare for the struggles for justice, wholeness, harmony. The early church was a religious minority and suffered daily harassment and discrimination. With the picture of a Roman soldier ready for battle, sword in hand, standing firm, the message given in this reading takes up the countercultural narrative of the scriptures and strangely becomes the ultimate vision of pacifism. The nature of the violent, oppressive, and powerful Roman soldier is in contrast with the behaviour of the Christian community. The church is called to put on other clothing and practice a new reality based on the life of Christ who brings peace.

Once again, the verbs and pronouns in this passage are plural, "you" is the many, not the individual. The church stands together in love and reconciliation, by peace and righteousness she works in the world and seeks to put into practice all the instructions already extolled before: living in love and peace with one another, singing hymns to God, speaking truth, and forgiving one another. The message ends with the exhortation to pray. Prayer is seen as the means by which the community of faith can stand in the holy presence of God and find strength.

In **John 6:56–69**, Jesus' disciples seem to be offended by his teachings, yet Peter recognizes that in Jesus is the "Holy One of God."

In Christ, the dwelling place for God, they have found their hope and strength to go on when others have turned back.

#### Connecting scripture and life

At the time when this letter to the Ephesians was written, it was normal to see soldiers walking around in armoured uniform, and many were victims of the soldiers' violence. With the power of Rome at its height, those wearing this armour must have seemed the very essence of strength and protection against their foes.

• Is there a correlation between our times and the times early Christians were living through as they faced violence and oppression?

While military imagery may not serve us well as the 21st-century church, the image of putting on protective clothing is still current as people of faith continue to live the way of Christ.

- Is the instruction to put on truth, righteousness, peace, and love any less relevant than it was in the first century?
- What practices will create within you a dwelling place for God?
