

ABM Reflection

Isaiah's words are a wonderful encouragement in a time of distress and a reminder that God's people have nothing to fear since God has redeemed them. They can pass through fire and water without harm. The psalmist also talks of the powers of destruction, and yet the people will be saved and blessed. Images which are present as we read of the baptism of Jesus who entered the waters of baptism that we too may know him as God's beloved Son.

- We pray for all preparing for baptism; and for those of us already baptised, we give thanks for those who led us to putting on Christ in the waters of baptism.
- Give thanks for the Church of Ceylon, which covers most of Sri Lanka, remembering their ministry in a multi-religious context.

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This Week's Readings

First Reading from the Prophet Isaiah 43.1-7

¹ But now thus says the Lord, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: Do not fear, for I have redeemed you;I have called you by name, you are mine. ² When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. ³ For I am the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Saviour. I give Egypt as your ransom, Ethiopia and Seba in exchange for you. ⁴ Because you are precious in my sight, and honoured, and I love you, I give people in return for you, nations in exchange for your life. ⁵ Do not fear, for I am with you; I will bring your offspring from the east, and from the west I will gather you; ⁶ I will say to the north, 'Give them up', and to the south, 'Do not withhold; bring my sons from far away and my daughters from the end of the earth ⁷ everyone who is called by my name, whom I created for my glory, whom I formed and made.'

Psalm 29

- ¹ Ascribe to the Lord, you powers of heaven: ascribe to the Lord glory and might.
- ² Ascribe to the Lord the honour due to his name:

O worship the Lord in the beauty of his holiness.

- ³ The voice of the Lord is upon the waters: the God of glory thunders, the Lord upon the great waters.
- ⁴ The voice of the Lord is mighty in operation: the voice of the Lord is a glorious voice.
- ⁵ The voice of the Lord breaks the cedar-trees: the Lord breaks in pieces the cedars of Lebanon.
- ⁶ He makes them skip like a calf:

Lebanon and Sirion like a young wild ox.

⁷ The voice of the Lord divides the lightning-flash: the voice of the Lord whirls the sands of the desert, the Lord whirls the desert of Kadesh.

⁸ The voice of the Lord rends the terebinth trees, and strips bare the forests:

in his temple all cry 'Glory.'

- ⁹ The Lord sits enthroned above the water-flood: the Lord sits enthroned as a king for ever.
- ¹⁰ The Lord will give strength to his people: the Lord will give to his people the blessing of peace.

Second Reading from Acts 8.14-17

¹⁴ Now when the apostles at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them. ¹⁵ The two went down and prayed for them that they might receive the Holy Spirit ¹⁶ (for as yet the Spirit had not come upon any of them; they had only been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus). ¹⁷ Then Peter and John laid their hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

THANKS BF TO GOD

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke 3.15-22 GLORY TO YOU, LORD JESUS CHRIST

¹⁵ As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, ¹⁶ John answered all of them by saying, 'I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. ¹⁷ His winnowing-fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.' ¹⁸ So, with many other exhortations, he proclaimed the good news to the people. ¹⁹ But Herod the ruler, who had been rebuked by him because of Herodias, his brother's wife, and because of all the evil things that Herod had done, ²⁰ added to them all by shutting up John in prison. ²¹ Now when all the people were baptized, and when Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, the heaven was opened, ²² and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased.'

PRAISE TO YOU LORD JESUS CHRIST

REFLECTION

Beloved

As we begin the Season after the Epiphany, we rejoice that God's word continues to hold promise and power in our lives, calling each of us by name through living waters. The voice from heaven blesses: "You are my [child], the Beloved; with you I am well pleased." After John immerses Jesus in baptism, God draws near and rejoices in him. In today's readings we are reminded to listen for God in words of hope and encouragement, and in the Holy Spirit's work in our communities.

Isaiah 43:1–7 Often, it is easy to feel alone and forgotten in life's inevitable difficult and trying times. These words were given to God's people in just such a time. And the prophet proclaims that God is present "because you are precious in my sight and honoured and I love you" (43:4).

Psalm 29 In this psalm, God's voice is heard in the glory of thunder, in the mighty waters, and in the flashing flame. The voice of God calls into our lives too, strong with promise.

Acts 8:14–17 The Holy Spirit descends upon the believers in Samaria through prayer and the laying on of hands. These Samaritans had been baptized, but for a reason that is not given in the text, had not received the Holy Spirit. Peter and John are sent to these believers to pray, lay their hands upon them, and offer the Spirit. The writer of Acts is reminding readers that baptism and blessing belong together. The Holy Spirit, which descends upon Jesus at baptism, is now present and active in the early church. The voice of God is carried on in the disciples and brings identity and authority to all.

Luke 3:15–17, 21–22 The culture into which Jesus was born had rigid social customs. People behaved in accordance with their status given at birth, never presuming more or less. Little would be expected of the son of a manual labourer from out-of-the-way Nazareth. For a person like Jesus, the right to speak in public or to interpret the Torah would need to be established and demonstrated. It is not surprising then that when Jesus spoke and taught, people would wonder at his boldness and question the source of his authority. Luke tells readers that Jesus receives this authority directly from God at his baptism. God comes to Jesus through the Holy Spirit in the form of a dove, identifying Jesus as the "Beloved." The readers of Luke would interpret and understand this voice from heaven as giving both authenticity and authority to Jesus' ministry.

The love that Jesus later proclaims in his ministry is first extended to him now. We, too, are given the promise that identity and authority are ours as we recognize God's presence in our lives and set out to begin God's work. Only four weeks ago, we read these verses with expectation and hope as we

Only four weeks ago, we read these verses with expectation and hope as we prepared for Jesus' coming. Repeated here, we experience them with new eyes and live them out a bit differently too. The expectation is being fulfilled, and in this Season after the Epiphany, we continue to look for and seek out signs of Jesus' reign in our world. This text asks us to make space to hear God's voice in our life — a voice we share with those around us, and that tells us that we, too, are God's beloved.

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The voice of God, which spoke from the clouds at Jesus' baptism, still speaks in lives today. It speaks a word of love and promise to all who are baptized, offering identity and belonging. In the form of the Holy Spirit, God's voice also speaks to us in prayer, in ritual and tradition, in loving actions, and in all who thirst for justice. Where do you hear God's voice in your life?

Connecting scripture and life

- How is the Holy Spirit moving in your community? Where does the spirit move for justice?
- How might God be speaking to you/your faith community about ways to care for those affected by the pandemic, economic distress, hunger, climate change?


FORGET!
