## Weekly Pastoral Reflection

The Church today stands with Peter in prison and Paul at the end of his journey, and hears Christ restoring and redirecting both. Faith is not a single moment of clarity but a lifelong weaving of rescue and response. There are times we are carried out of confinement, and times we are asked simply to endure faithfully. There are moments of failure that become the very ground of renewed calling. Peter is restored by love, not perfection. Paul is crowned not for success, but perseverance. And the Church is reminded that discipleship is never comparison, never competition, but steady attention to Christ's voice: "Follow me." In every season, God is present, opening doors, standing beside us, and leading us onward.

## Sentence & Prayer of the Day

**Sentence:** Peter says to Jesus, 'Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you.'  
John 21.17

**Prayer of the Day:** Almighty God, whose apostles Peter and Paul glorified you in their deaths as in their lives: grant that your Church, inspired by their teaching and example, and knit together in unity by your Spirit, may ever stand firm upon the one foundation, your Son Jesus Christ our Lord; who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen

## Readings

### First Reading from Acts 12.1-11

<sup>1</sup>About that time King Herod laid violent hands upon some who belonged to the church. <sup>2</sup>He had James, the brother of John, killed with the sword. <sup>3</sup>After he saw that it pleased the Jews, he proceeded to arrest Peter also. (This was during the festival of Unleavened Bread.) <sup>4</sup>When he had seized him, he put him in prison and handed him over to four squads of soldiers to guard him, intending to bring him out to the people after the Passover. <sup>5</sup>While Peter was kept in prison, the church prayed fervently to God for him.

<sup>6</sup>The very night before Herod was going to bring him out, Peter, bound with two chains, was sleeping between two soldiers, while guards in front of the door were keeping watch over the prison. <sup>7</sup>Suddenly an angel of the Lord appeared and a light shone in the cell. He tapped Peter on the side and woke him, saying, 'Get up quickly.' And the chains fell off his wrists. <sup>8</sup>The angel said to him, 'Fasten your belt and put on your sandals.' He did so. Then he said to him, 'Wrap your cloak around you and follow me.' <sup>9</sup>Peter went out and followed him; he did not realize that what was happening with the angel's help was real; he thought he was seeing a vision. <sup>10</sup>After they had passed the first and the second guard, they came before the iron gate leading into the city. It opened for them of its own accord, and they went outside and walked along a lane, when suddenly the angel left him. <sup>11</sup>Then Peter came to himself and said, 'Now I am sure that the Lord has sent his angel and rescued me from the hands of Herod and from all that the Jewish people were expecting.'

**THANKS BE TO GOD.**

**Biblical background** Peter is imprisoned during a time of persecution. The Church prays, and God sends an angel to free him from chains and guarded doors.

**Meaning & relevance today** God is present in what feels locked and impossible. Even when circumstances look sealed, divine freedom is already at work.

**Reflection question** Where in my life do I need to trust that God can open what feels firmly shut?

### **Psalm 87**

<sup>1</sup> He has founded it upon a holy hill:  
and the Lord loves the gates of Zion more than all the dwellings of Jacob.

<sup>2</sup> **Glorious things shall be spoken of you:**

**O Zion, city of our God.**

<sup>3</sup> I might speak of my kindred in Egypt or in Babylon:  
in Philistia, Tyre or Nubia, where each was born.

<sup>4</sup> **But of Zion it shall be said:**

**many were born in her, he that is Most High has established her.**

<sup>5</sup> When the Lord draws up the record of the nations:  
he shall take note where everyone was born.

<sup>6</sup> **And the singers and the dancers together:**

**Shall make their song to your name.**

### **Second Reading from 2 Timothy 4.6-8, 4.17-18**

<sup>6</sup>As for me, I am already being poured out as a libation, and the time of my departure has come. <sup>7</sup>I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith.

<sup>8</sup>From now on there is reserved for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will give to me on that day, and not only to me but also to all who have longed for his appearing. <sup>17</sup>But the Lord stood by me and gave me strength, so that through me the message might be fully proclaimed and all the Gentiles might hear it. So I was rescued from the lion's mouth.

<sup>18</sup>The Lord will rescue me from every evil attack and save me for his heavenly kingdom. To him be the glory for ever and ever. Amen.

**Biblical background** Paul writes near the end of his life, reflecting on faithfulness, loneliness, and God's sustaining presence.

**Meaning & relevance today** A life of faith is not measured by comfort or success, but by perseverance and trust that God remains present to the end.

**Reflection question** What would it look like for me to finish my "race" with faithfulness rather than comparison?

### The Holy Gospel

#### The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John 15-22

#### GLORY TO YOU, LORD JESUS CHRIST

<sup>15</sup>When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, 'Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?' He said to him, 'Yes, Lord; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Feed my lambs.' <sup>16</sup>A second time he said to him, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' He said to him, 'Yes, Lord; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Tend my sheep.' <sup>17</sup>He said to him the third time, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' Peter felt hurt because he said to him the third time, 'Do you love me?' And he said to him, 'Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Feed my sheep. <sup>18</sup>Very truly, I tell you, when you were younger, you used to fasten your own belt and to go wherever you wished. But when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will fasten a belt around you and take you where you do not wish to go.' <sup>19</sup>(He said this to indicate the kind of death by which he would glorify God.) After this he said to him, 'Follow me.' <sup>20</sup>Peter turned and saw the disciple whom Jesus loved following them; he was the one who had reclined next to Jesus at the supper and had said, 'Lord, who is it that is going to betray you?' <sup>21</sup>When Peter saw him, he said to Jesus, 'Lord, what about him?' <sup>22</sup>Jesus said to him, 'If it is my will that he remain until I come, what is that to you? Follow me!'

For the Gospel of the Lord

**PRAISE TO YOU LORD JESUS CHRIST**

**Biblical background** The risen Jesus restores Peter after his denial and calls him to follow, redirecting him away from comparison with others.

**Meaning & relevance today** Christ restores us from failure and calls us to our own unique path of discipleship without comparing our journey to others.

**Reflection question** Where am I being invited to stop comparing and simply follow Jesus?
